The emergency water supply system is now operational. It was tested last week. The Bryce Spring water, on demand, will be diverted from irrigation use to the tanks. A solar powered system of pumps valeves can be activated so that the water will be purified up to the state water standards as it goes into the tanks.

Reminder, the town's water is sampled and tested each month at various locations. Contact Klinton Chynoweth if you'd like your home spicket water tested. Quarterly test results are all within state parameters.
